Assistant Vice-Provost Student Success

The Assistant Vice-Provost Student Success provides strategic leadership and administrative oversight in the planning, design and assessment of programs, services, and initiatives, across the student journey, from transition to study, graduation and beyond as alumni. The position has operational responsibility for areas of Academic Success (Learning Skills, the First-Year Experience, Transition Programs), Career Exploration and Development, Student Accessibility Services, and Student Engagement (Residence Life, Student Life (including Orientation, parent and family programming, student organization support and student leadership) and Indigenous Student Services), and the Student Virtual Assistant program.

Reporting to the Vice Provost Students, the Assistant Vice-Provost Student Success fosters a collaborative environment across the academic support and engagement offices applying the critical lenses of equity, diversity and inclusion, access, well-being and learning to ensure academic achievement and social inclusion of York's diverse student community. The Student Success area plays a key role in providing students with a well-rounded University experience that is not just primarily academic to ensure they gain leadership skills and community awareness to be global citizens.



The ideal candidate is a skilled communicator and facilitator. They must: have a deep and abiding commitment to equity, diversity, and inclusion in all their forms; have the ability to understand student needs from an intersectional lens; leverage data to ensure decisions are evidence-based and routinely measured, and to support the development and assessment of retention intervention programs; and, bring a holistic approach to their work ensuring student success extends beyond intellectual pursuits to include the cultivation of purpose, efficacy, and social consciousness. The person most likely to realize success in the role brings senior administrative experience from a university, public sector, or similar environment, and has experience with curriculum and pedagogy either as an academic or someone who has had an opportunity to work closely with students in a learning capacity. A PhD or Master's degree is sought, preferably in the area of education, leadership and policy, student development, or related fields of study, as is an individual who will play an active role in advancing the Division of Students' vision as *Partners in Student Success*.

The University welcomes applications from all qualified individuals, including, but not limited to women, persons with disabilities, visible minorities (racialized), Indigenous Peoples and persons of any gender identity and sexual orientation. York University is committed to a positive, supportive and inclusive environment.
